As an organization dedicated to fostering growth and collaboration within the electrical industry, NCEL continues to provide numerous opportunities for learning, community engagement, and professional development.

The pinnacle of our achievements in 2023 was the resounding success of the Upper Midwest Electrical Expo, held on April 19th & 20th at the Minneapolis Convention Center's Hall B. The new location provided an ideal setting for industry leaders to connect, explore cutting-edge technologies, and gain insights into the latest trends. Beyond the Expo, our year was marked by a series of successes, including six NCEA workshops, multiple PluggedIN events, and the inaugural season of the NCEL Women's Group, which was created to empower and celebrate the contributions of women in the industry.

In addition to these milestones, we are proud to have hosted the NCEMC Charity Golf Classic, benefitting the Pinky Swear Foundation, the Sporting Clays Classic Shootout, benefitting Folds of Honor, and a memorable summer social on Lake Minnetonka for our members. Monthly NCEES and NCEMC meetings served as valuable platforms for ongoing collaboration and knowledge-sharing. # Charitable Giving

Each year, North Central Electrical League makes it a priority to give back to our community. This year we had a goal of achieving 500 volunteer hours throughout our organization. Thanks to the efforts of our members and staff, we were able to surpass that goal and have volunteered a total of 565 hours!

NCEL's 6th Annual Recharging the Community Week, which took place from June 12-16th this year, is a significant initiative for the organization to give back to the community. During this week, NCEL staff and members volunteered for 5 different charitable organizations. This included activities such as Urban Roots Park Restoration, where we planted trees and removed invasive plant species, as well as volunteering at Feed My Starving Children, where volunteers packed 26,784 meals. Additionally, we participated in A Brush With Kindness, where our volunteers primed, painted, and repaired a home for a local family in need, and at Bridging, where we loaded trucks full of donated household furniture and essentials to be sent to previously homeless individuals who are getting their first dwellings. This week of giving back showcases NCEL's commitment to making a positive impact on the community through volunteer work.

Other charitable efforts enacted throughout the year include individual volunteer efforts from our members, such as donating blood for the American Red Cross, volunteering on school boards and at churches, planting trees, picking up trash and bell ringing for the Salvation Army.

Perhaps our biggest charitable endeavor, NCEL as a whole awarded 30+ scholarships in 2023, totaling \$89,500 to children of our members.

We look forward to another year of giving in 2024!



### NCEMC

NCEMC boasts 163 members.

#### **Outings and Opportunities**

The 39th Biannual Upper Midwest Electrical Expo took place April 19th and 20th, 2023 at the Minneapolis Convention Center.

This year's Expo had over 300 booths.

A record breaking 4,421 pre-registrations were received for this year's Expo, with a total of 7,199 attendees over 2 days.

On Student Day, 857 students from school across the Midwest attended to learn about the various companies in the industry and to attend the first ever job fair at the Expo, in which 17 companies participated.

Former NFL player Greg Coleman spoke at the Expo Breakfast on April 20th on the topic of Flipping the Field- Making a Difference in Your Organization.
